Curriculum Drivers:
Science

ENGLISH

The children will primarily be taught about how to write non-narrative pieces, including writing reports about keeping healthy and food groups and instructions about how to make a salad. Weekly class reciprocal reading and comprehension sessions will help the children with their understanding of texts. Dictionary skills will also be covered.

MATHS

The children will be following our 'Big Maths' programme during the course of the year, focusing particularly on counting, number facts, mental calculations and column methods. These will be applied to real life problems to encourage mastery. Shape, measures, fractions and statistics will also be taught. Weekly tests will help inform the teachers of their progress.

SCIENCE

The children will be taught about the need for humans to eat the right types and amounts of nutrition and they will also learn about the functions of the skeleton and muscles. A trip to Eureka will enable the children to explore these objectives further and learn more about the human body.

ART/DT

The children will design and make a model of a healthy balanced meal, using model magic. These will be painted using different brush sizes. They will assemble ingredients to make a salad. Also, the children will replicate patterns by printing a skeleton on a t-shirt.

COMPUTING

The children will learn how to design a presentation about the skeleton.
