### Impact of purchases on pupils

#### New Athletics Equipment

This has been used in lessons for all year groups to develop agility and balance in the lower years and more specific skills in KS2. It has also enabled the children to train for Sportshall Athletics competitions, contributing to the school team becoming county champions and placing 3<sup>rd</sup> at eth Level 3 regional competition. We have also been able to identify further resources, through changes to the way athletics is taught as a result of this equipment, that would benefit the children. This is to be bought from next year's funding.

#### New gymnastics equipment

This has allowed balance skills and routines in particular to be developed in all year groups. Pupils have been able to develop their skills more effectively, using a wider range of equipment. Our extra-curricular clubs have been used to develop more advanced skills, which were demonstrated in a display in the opening ceremonies of our sports days.

#### New General Sports Equipment

Every PE and Games lesson has had enough high quality equipment available for effective learning to take place. This has resulted in higher quality learning taking place across the school and has added to the children's excitement about sport and PE. Children have been able to try sports they previously did not have the opportunity to.

#### School Sports partnership

Again we decided to opt in to the South Hunsley School Sports Partnership and this decision has been fully justified. The events organised at the local secondary schools, the county finals and the regional finals have been well organised and enjoyed by a whole range of our chn. We have taken part in a wide range of sporting events (football, biathlon, cross-country, sportshall athletics, benchball, swimming, quad kids, rounders, netball and tag rugby) This level of variety and competition is why again we will be opting into the partnership as the chn, staff and parents all agree it is a great opportunity for the chn to play competitive sport. Furthermore, our staff have taken advantage of the free CPD training sessions offered as part of the membership, developing their skills in teaching gymnastics, athletics and multi-skills in particular.

### Minibus Licence for Sports Co-ordinator

Having a qualified minibus driver has already saved the school hundreds of pounds in transport costs, thus allowing more children to be taken out of school to take part in sports activities, for example, we were able to target a group of less active girls to take to a girls football festival and we have been able to enter additional competitions further afield. Thanks to the deal East Riding County Council have with Northgate Vehicle Hire, it costs just £24 + fuel to hire a minibus for a day, as opposed to an average of around £150 per short journey on a coach. We have also been able to make additional links with schools further away for inter-school competitions.

### Transport

Being able to pay for transport has allowed children who would not otherwise have been involved to take part in inter-school competitions and events, increasing the percentages of children involved significantly across the whole of KS2 in particular.

### Competition Entries

By paying competition entry fees, our children have had access to a higher level of schools sport. In the case of biathlon, we were able to qualify for and subsequently enter the national final at Olympic Park, London, at which our school placed 4<sup>th</sup> in Great Britain in the U10 boys category! This has given us the opportunity to really stretch our more able children in particular.

### Intra-school biathlon

Organising our own biathlon, run by school staff at a local leisure centre allowed a large number of children (68) from Y4-6 compete in a different sport and also provided opportunities for them to achieve qualifying times for the county final. This event above all others raised the profile of sport in our school this year, as it involved so many children. As a result, we will be introducing an inter-house competition for the whole of KS2 next year.

### Staff Accommodation and Transport for National Biathlon Championships

Without paying for this, it would not have been possible for our qualifiers to get to the very top level of competition or have the opportunity to compete in such prestigious a venue as Olympic Park. This event took place on a Sunday and due to the distance, it would have been unreasonable to expect staff members to travel to London for an 8:00am start to manage the team.

### Pool Hire

As we do not have a swimming pool, this allowed us to take children to train for swimming competitions and biathlon competitions as a compromise to no swimming lessons being offered as part of the curriculum due to the refurbishment of the local leisure centre pool. A swimming teacher very kindly volunteered her time to coach the children. Lessons will be purchased again in 2014-15, once the leisure centre is re-opened. The results were 4<sup>th</sup> place at the county swimming final and high national rankings in the biathlon championships.

### Cover for staff

This has allowed staff to be released in order to develop their own teaching, to staff sports events and to allow the sport co-ordinator a small amount of time to organise events, resulting in higher quality provision for all children.
