History - The Vikings

There were many Viking raids which marked a long struggle between the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings for control of Britain.

In the 9th century, the English king Alfred the Great agreed peace with the Vikings and stopped them taking over all of England.

Some Vikings settled down to live in their own area of eastern England, called the Danelaw. The Anglo-Saxon lands were roughly to the west.
